

Year 1/2 Term 2 Overview

English

Reading: We will continue to develop our Franklin reading strategies under the banners of comprehension and meaning, fluency, decoding and a culture of reading during our daily readers workshops. Students will also continue to work towards their individual reading goals.

Spelling: We are continuing our spelling groups (Year 1 & Year 2) during which students learn about letter patterns and their associated sounds. Students display their understanding of these concepts by completing activities, such as word hunts, word sorts and writing sentences.

<u>Writing:</u> Students will continue to work on their individual writing goals and be exposed to more of the Franklin Writing Progressions through explicit mini lessons. Students will be learning about the structure and grammatical features of retells, recounts and information reports. We will explore different types of punctuation to use in our writing and further develop editing skills.

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Mathematics

This term in Mathematics we will be covering the following topics:

- Number
- Addition and subtraction strategies (including counting on and back, partitioning, friends of 10 and doubles/halves)
- Place value
- Representations of one half (half of a whole and half of a group)

We will also be reviewing:

- Patterns with numbers and objects
- 2D and 3D shapes
- Measurement comparing lengths, volume, capacity, mass and area using informal units
- Direction moving from place to place



Health & Physical Education

During the first half of term 2 students will be continuing their **Athletics** unit consisting of running, jumping and throwing disciplines such as relays, sprints, javelin, shot put, discus and long jump. The second half of the term they will participate in

'Bounce,' a **tennis** unit with associated games and activities targeted at their developmental level, incorporating grip, swing, bounce, movement,

Science


This term year 1 will explore patterns of events that occur on Earth and in the sky, such as the appearance of the moon and stars at night, the weather and the seasons.

Year 2 will be working to describe changes to objects, materials and living things, focusing on water. They will explore how water is used and how it is transferred from its source to its point of use.

<u>Humanities and Social Sciences - Geography</u>

We are learning about People and Places:

- Identifying the features of familiar places (natural, constructed and managed)
- Investigating the names and meanings given to local places, including by the Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander peoples
- Interpreting data and information displayed in pictures, texts and maps
- Exploring ways to care for special places



Important Information
