

Morning Routine

Students can come onto school grounds from 8:40 in the morning. We ask for all students to go to *Morning lines* on the COLA when the school song begins at 8:55am.

Please ensure that your child is at school ready for learning at 8:55am.

Students place bags at their classroom door and play on the playground until Morning lines. After morning lines, students walk back to class, unpack their bags and begin read to self.



English



Reader's Workshops

- Independent reading: Each morning will begin with 10-15mins of independent reading to encourage learners to build stamina and engage with a range of text types.
- We will be using the Readers Workshop model for reading instruction. Learners will practise selecting authentic texts that match their personal interests and reading level, and utilising strategies such as making connections, inferring, and predicting to better understand texts.

Writer's Workshops

- During writers workshop learners will follow a process of generating ideas, organising ideas, drafting, and editing, with a focus on using success criteria to improve their own and others' work.
- Spelling, grammar, punctuation, and speaking/listening will be integrated into the core writing program through focus lessons
- Handwriting will be taught throughout the week and learners will be encouraged to utilise their handwriting skills throughout other writing tasks.

Support and extension

 Small workshop groups will be offered in all literacy sessions to support and extend learners

124 Mathematics



- Our mathematics curriculum is presented in 3 content areas:
 Number & Algebra, Measurement & Geography, and Statistics
 & Probability. These content areas will be underpinned by daily mental computation practise and problem solving, which requires learners to apply their understanding of mathematical strategies and skills to more complex problems.
- Learners will work collaboratively and in focus groups to support and extend their understanding.
- Learners will engage with maths concepts in a range of formats such as through games, manipulatives, and open-ended tasks/problem solving



Science and Technology



Technology:

Each class will have a lesson per week with Sam who will be teaching the importance of being a good digital citizen. This will include learning about online safety, how to use functions of digital technology, and using technology as an educational resource.

Science:

In science, students will be exploring The Sun, Earth and Moon, changes of state in chemical science, classification of living things based on their observable features, along with the processes associated with heat energy. We look forward to lots of hands-on and experiential learning in science this year.

Mandarin

Franklin School is learning Mandarin as the focus language from Year 3 onward. Each class has a 1 hour session per week with a specialist teacher named Xiao. Students learn about Mandarin language and culture.





HASS (History and Geography)



This term we will be exploring 'Country and Place' in History, and the Australian Continent in Geography.



The Arts



Throughout this year the children will explore the arts with a specialist teacher

Visual Arts

- Explore ideas and artworks from different cultures and times to use as inspiration for their own representations
- Use materials, techniques and processes to explore visual conventions when making artworks

Dance

- Explore physical movement
- Develop team building skills
- We will have Passion and Purpose again this year.

Drama

- Explore their ideas through drama and characterisation
- Express their ideas through storytelling

Media Arts & Music

- Use media technologies to manipulate sounds, images and text to tell stories
- Plan, create and present media artworks with awareness of responsible media use
- We will be having drumming with Cherie in Term 1, Starting in week 2.



- Lunch Play 1:05 pm


Students have opportunities to participate in lunch time clubs throughout the term - Daily clubs are announced during morning lines

Technology at Franklin School

Franklin School is committed to enrich the learning of each student. One way we do this is through the use of technology in the classroom. Teachers at Franklin utilise a variety of Web Based Service Providers – some of which you will be familiar with. These systems provide a variety of resources for students and teachers to use that cannot be provided by other means.

Students:

For students attending after-school care: As we are encouraging more independence in year 3, students will make their own way to after school care and 'drop and go' areas where executive staff will be there to support.

Please let the classroom teacher know your pick up arrangement or of any changes, so we can support your child with this transition.

Please call the front office if you are running late. Please speak to your child about where they will be picked up.

Seesaw

Seesaw will be the formal portfolio platform to view student's learning and achievements. The students' learning will be posted electronically and sent home online for you to keep.

How can you help your child?

- ★ Encourage your child to take responsibility for their belongings

- Numeracy
